Music Director Stephen Henley departs for Renewal Leave May 1

Music Director and organist Stephen Henley commences a well-earned renewal leave on May 1. By the time Steve returns to BAPC on August 1, he will have attended conferences here in America and traveled to Great Britain to study and take in that country's rich heritage of organs and organ music. The Session granted Steve the three-month sabbatical or renewal leave in accordance with a policy adopted in 2005. Professional staff members are eligible for renewal leave upon six years of consecutive service with the congregation, and every six years thereafter.

While we will all miss Stephen's music and worship leadership while he is away, I cannot imagine having a colleague more deserving of such as renewal leave. Stephen is first of all a delight to work with, continually coming up with fresh and effective ways to enhance our worship. Stephen is hard-working, literally burning the "midnight oil" most nights. (A profound introvert, not much pleases Steve more than to have a few hours to himself to play the organ) And Steve is the consummate *church* musician, whose faith is displayed and witness given every time his fingers touch the keys and his feet the pedals.

Stephen has lined up some fine musicians to play and lead during his absence. Ernest "Buddy" Suerken and Lynn Clayton will handle the organ and the choir during early May. Kenna Payne, who has often played for us, will handle the musical duties from May 20 through July 31st. Members of the choir will coordinate other aspects of the music ministry.

Our prayers and blessings go with you Steve, during your time of professional and spiritual renewal.

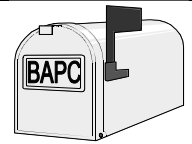

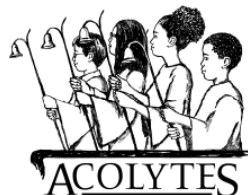
Pentecost Offering May 31



Since 1998 Presbyterians have raised over \$7 million in order to help meet the needs of children-at-risk, youth, and young adults. We are encouraged to keep 40 percent of the Offering to support ministries with children-at-risk in our community. Scholarships and programs for children of incarcerated family members are examples of how we have used our money in the past.

The other 60%, which is used by the General Assembly, is to provide leadership development opportunities for Presbyterian youth and your adults and supports children-at-risk programs at the national level. Twenty-five percent of their money goes to ministries with youth and young adults such as the Pathways program. Twenty-five percent helps young adult volunteers with the Young Adult Volunteer Program and ten percent is used for child advocacy ministries such as Presbyterians in Covenant with Children.

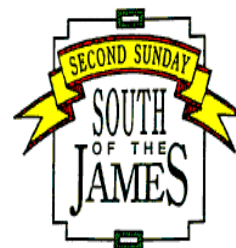


The Presbyterian Women's Birthday May 12—11:45

THE BAPC SESSION REPORTS

At its regularly scheduled meeting on Sunday, April 5, 2009 the Session:

- Heard that the New Church Development Committee, POJ, has concurred in the need for a new church to be located in the Flat Rock area on Rte 60, Powhatan County.
- Heard that the owner of 2755 Jimmy Winters Road (at corner of Huguenot Road) approached the church to see if the church is interested in purchasing the property. A committee will report back to the Session on options and considerations.
- Approved a revised bequest policy on the treatment of estate gifts made to the church.
- Approved the "Gifts and Memorials" booklet be amended to include the new Theological Student Scholarship Fund.
- Approved to accept a gift of \$2,500 from the family of Virginia Beck Tompkins to provide the equipment and partial installation for audio visual equipment for the Beck Room. Also, approved \$700 from the Building Renovation Fund to apply to completing the installation.
- Approved the position description for the Associate Pastor for Education and Youth.
- Approved to expand the Evangelism and Membership Division to include two co-moderators, one focusing on membership and one focusing on evangelism / marketing / publicity-public relations. This change recognizes the growth of evangelism activities at BAPC.
- Approved the development of a media strategy with clear, attainable, and measurable goals concerning what audiences we want to reach and with what messages.
- Heard that the RISC rally held on March 23, had over 200 people in attendance.
- Approved a \$200 gift from the Memorial Fund to the BAPC Stickers for yarn and supplies.
- Heard that two fallen soldiers families were sent prayer shawls and a copy of the March 15, worship service bulletin containing the blessing of the shawls.
- Approved the Pictorial Directory Company be allowed to use BAPC Pictorial Directory general pictures in their advertizing.
- Heard that the Yoga classes start on April 23.
- Heard that the Nominating Committee will be securing three members to serve on the Endowment Fund Committee.
- Heard that two offsite directional signs to the church were installed and a third sign will be installed soon.

At a Called Session Meeting on April 1, 2009, the Session:

- Convened for the purpose of examining and receiving the 2009 Confirmation Class into membership in the church.
- Declared that this portion of the examination was completed and approved to move the meeting into the sanctuary and to adjourn the meeting with the benediction at the end of the communion service.
- The following Session resolution was approved: That each of these young adults be admitted to full church membership upon their public professions of faith.
- In the worship service the following members of the confirmation class offered their personal statements of faith: Bruce Ensley, Julia Gallini, Rebecca Huffine, Rheanna Morris, Joseph Pankey, and Jake Wilkes.
- The confirmands made their professions of faith. The charge to the new members was offered by Associate Pastor Smith. The new members were greeted after the service.

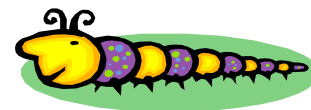

Kid's Kingdom in WORM



The Workshop Rotation for the month of May is Mission. The memory verse is Matthew 25:40 "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."

This familiar passage from Matthew is usually seen in light of judgment, where Christ will separate the sheep from the goats. The sheep, the righteous, showed by their actions the love of Christ. They fed, gave drink, clothed, and visited. The goats, however, did not do those things.

For our purposes we will look at the text in relation to seeing ourselves as missionaries "doing Christ's work" in the way that we treat others. A definition of missionary is "someone who is sent on a mission." We have all been sent on a mission to show the peace and love of Christ to all that we meet.

This is a different rotation format than has been presented before at BAPC. The idea of mission is very broad. We chose 4 aspects of education about mission to focus our workshops: Equality, Peace, Hunger, and Homelessness. Join us this month as we explore mission in our exciting workshops:

Arcade – children play simulation games regarding money & resources & their unequal distribution in the world, as well as how access to them impacts one's health, well-being & quality of life.

Art – a health kit workshop – children will prepare & decorate health kits & greeting cards which will be packaged & saved for CARITAS. Older children will make soap to include in the health kits.

Storytelling/Geography - children will participate in a hands-on activity to help them understand how food is distributed in the world – they will discuss ways that we can address the problem of hunger at home & in the world at large.

AV/Media – children will listen to a speaker talk about CARITAS Family Focus & then will produce a video challenge of their own role in this project.

We look forward to seeing each of you on Sunday morning as we explore mission and doing Christ's work in the world. "Preach the gospel at ALL times, if necessary use words." St. Francis of Assisi used these words which encourages us to go into the world and allow our actions to do the work of Christ's hands.

Railroad enthusiast Randy Ridgely will bring “Pictures of Railroads Past and Present” to the Friday, May 15, meeting of Mature Moderns.

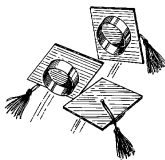
